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Section 1 – Executive summary

Introduction

For the WA health system, our continued focus on ensuring people in Western Australia receive safe, high quality and accessible health services has been underscored by a period of significant reform and change since 2014.

This has included major structural change, through the implementation of devolved governance, and the establishment of Health Service Provider Boards underpinned by the introduction of the *Health Services Act 2016*, as well as significant reforms through major strategic programs such as the *Sustainable Health Review*, which aims to drive a cultural shift, focusing on prevention and community care, supported by a modern hospital system.

Alongside these reforms, the Western Australian community has benefited from the commissioning of new hospitals to provide care in modern, state of the art facilities across the State, including Fiona Stanley Hospital, Perth Children’s Hospital and Karratha Health Campus.

In addition, the use of telehealth, such as videoconferencing and other digital technologies, has expanded significantly throughout country WA. This technology now supports innovative solutions that are improving health service access and the health journey for country people, particularly providing specialist and multi-disciplinary care closer to home.

Early this year, I requested the establishment of a small project team supported by an Executive Working Group led by Dr Robyn Lawrence, Deputy Chief Health Officer Clinical Services to review and update the last iteration of the *Clinical Services Framework 2014–2024*.

This project, like so much of the ‘business as usual’ work within the WA health system, has continued within the environment of the health system’s response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Western Australia’s health system, like others across Australia and globally, has faced new challenges in navigating and adapting to this unprecedented pandemic.

For the WA health system, responding to the challenges faced by our hospitals and community services through this time has further emphasised the criticality of a contemporary clinical planning document informed by the current environment and aligned to the health system’s priorities to ensure WA’s health services well placed to the ongoing and changing needs of the community.

The *Clinical Services Framework 2020 Addendum* provides an interim, guiding resource, referencing the number of the major structural and strategic reforms that play a pivotal role in the way health services are delivered across the WA health system, in addition to providing updated public and private hospital matrices.

Delivering safe, high quality and sustainable health services that support and improve the health of all Western Australians remains our focus, and the *Clinical Service Framework 2014–2024* and supported by this update, the *Clinical Services Framework 2020 Addendum* both provide a foundation for the whole health system in planning to meet the demand for health services given changing service capabilities and evolving models of care. They

remain a reference point for determining requirements in workforce and infrastructure and for integrating new technology.

To ensure our services are well-placed to support people across the continuum of care into the coming decade and beyond, the Department of Health will commence work at the end of 2020 to develop a completely revised and comprehensively updated clinical services planning document to support health system planning in the coming decade. It will provide a contemporary view of how services should develop over time to achieve better access to safe and quality care with minimum duplication and best use of available resources.

It is anticipated that this next update will provide a robust and revised blueprint for the whole health system in planning for services (across hospitals and community services), workforce, infrastructure, technology and budgeting in line with the strategic intent of the health system, framed by the changing demographics of the State, increasing complexity of disease, environmental factors, service capability and Government policy.

Informed by our current environment and the number of significant changes and reforms to the WA health system over recent years, I am pleased to provide the *Clinical Services Framework 2020 Addendum*, a renewed document for the next two years.

Overview to the Clinical Services Framework 2020 Addendum

Background

As system manager, the Department of Health has responsibility for ensuring the resources provided to the WA public health system are allocated in a manner which reflects the prioritised health needs of the WA population.

The Department is responsible for leading the system in determining the overall health needs of the WA population and the prioritisation of these needs in relation to available resources.

Historically the Clinical Services Framework (CSF) has reflected the system's agreed prioritised need, at a clinical service level. It utilises a service delineation to reflect a service profile across the State which aims to deliver equity, access, safety and efficiency.

It provides a blueprint for the whole health system in planning for services, workforce, infrastructure, technology and budgeting in line with the strategic intent of the health system. This is framed in the context of the changing demographics of the State, increasing complexity of disease, environmental factors, service capability and Government policy.

Previous updates to the Clinical Services Framework

The *Clinical Services Framework 2014–2024 (CSF 2014–2024)* was the third high-level service framework to be produced by WA Health. The CSF is completely refreshed at intervals of approximately five years. Updates were last published covering:

- 2005–2015
- 2010–2020
- 2014/15–2024/25.

The current 2014/15–2024/25 update responds to a greater than anticipated growth in the volume of demand for services, a change in the economic environment and recent and imminent adjustments to the configuration of services, including the opening of new facilities.

While the *CSF 2014–2024* was developed prior to significant reforms through the implementation of the *Health Services Act 2016*, the intent of the CSF remains relevant at a system level and it remains the foundation for clinical service delineation, capacity modelling and some funding decisions.

About the Clinical Services Refresh – November 2020

In June 2020, the Department of Health began the Clinical Services Refresh, a project to produce a targeted update of the *CSF 2014–2024*.

This includes the development of a contemporary clinical plan to guide optimal clinical service development across the system. The project is being completed in three phases:



To support the first Phase of this project, an Executive Working Group and small project team was formed and tasked with:

- Updating the document to clarify existing inconsistencies
- Developing a consistent, transparent and fair mechanism to assess proposed changes to service profiles
- Identifying and assessing urgent, non-complex service changes which, due to safety, quality or performance issues needed to be addressed within Phase 1.

Scope of this update

The *Clinical Services Framework 2020 Addendum* ensures the WA health system has a contemporary clinical plan to guide optimal clinical service development over the short, medium and longer term.

This interim update is focused on ensuring the key components of the CSF are current and robust enough to guide the system over the next two years while Phase 2 of the project is undertaken.

It also aims to address any urgent services changes which will help improve performance, access, safety or quality of services.

This is reflected in updates to the following areas of the *CSF 2014–2024*:

- Characteristics of the WA Population
- Metropolitan and WACHS Hospital Services Matrix
- Non-government Health Service Providers Matrix.

Areas out of scope for this update are:

- Health Support Services
- Quadriplegic Centre
- PathWest
- Community and Integrated Services providers.

Consultation and assessment process

Consultation was a vital element in developing the *Clinical Services Framework 2020 Addendum*, to ensure this update is accurate, relevant and comprehensive, to guide clinical planning and the provision of health services over the next two years.

Updates and contributions were received from Health Service Providers and private hospitals as part of this update. This included review of all service delineations and definitions, with input provided from:

- Health Service Providers:
 - Child and Adolescent Health Service
 - North Metropolitan Health Service
 - South Metropolitan Health Service
 - East Metropolitan Health Service
 - WA Country Health Service.
- Private hospitals:
 - Bethesda Hospital
 - Ramsay Health Care
 - St John of God Health Care
 - The Mount Hospital.

Assessment of changes to the previous matrices

All proposed service changes received through the consultation process were reviewed and considered by the Executive Working Group (EWG) using a decision-making tool. It included 10 areas for assessment:

1. History
2. Health Need
3. Implications
4. Safety and Quality
5. Enablers
6. Government Policy
7. Strategic Direction
8. Performance Implications
9. Value to Community and/or Government
10. Governance and timeframes.

The EWG considered information across each of these 10 areas to assess the impact of proposed service changes in a consistent way.

Clarification and further advice were sought and provided from Health Service Providers and within the Department of Health to understand the impact of any proposed changes now and going forward.

How changes to service delineations have been represented

The last update to the Clinical Services Framework 2024–25 was published in 2018.

In this update, the Hospital Matrices reflect the levels of service across two time intervals, current (2020/21) and 2024/25.

In terms of the 2020/21 interval, two positions have been reflected – the endorsed level and the actual level of service.

Each service change was considered by the EWG before a recommendation was made to the Director General for final decision, and inclusion in the *Clinical Services Framework 2020 Addendum*.

In some instances, the EWG recommended some service changes be deferred to the next phase of work to be progressed in 2021. This included:

- Strategic issues, related to systemwide principles, value and a longer-term approach to needs-based assessment and modelling
- Systemwide specialty reviews, identified through the service changes requested through one or more HSPs
- Site-based or regional reviews, where location-based issues were identified through the EWG’s consideration of all proposed service changes
- Community and statewide services.

Further consideration of these service changes were recommended by the EWG as part of planned work to consider the long-term requirements of a clinical services planning tool for the WA health system.

Next steps

Phase 2 of the Clinical Services Framework Refresh project is planned to commence from January 2021.

Over the next 18–24 months a small project team in the Department of Health will be responsible for the development of a contemporary clinical plan to guide optimal clinical service development across the system.

The process will be heavily informed by consultation with a broad range of stakeholders and supported by input from established health system reference groups and Committees with appropriate membership from the broader health system.

Phase 2 of the project, which will be overseen by a Steering Committee, will focus on:

- The development of a contemporary and revised document which addresses current and future requirements for the WA health system's clinical planning
- Ensuring key systemwide issues are comprehensively considered through the completion of detailed review, analysis and assessment of service profiles
- Ensuring the parameters of safety, quality and performance are comprehensively and consistently addressed through the document
- Ensuring a contemporary approach is adopted to clinical service delineation, capacity modelling, and some funding decisions to support the long-term requirements of the health system.
- Utilising a consistent, transparent and fair mechanism to assess proposed changes to service profiles.
- Recommending systemwide principles and embedding processes to support decisions regarding proposed modifications to the clinical services framework and the integration of systemwide planning in to a robust commissioning cycle.

Section 2 – Strategic Environment and Context

Structural reforms

Health Services Act 2016

The *Health Services Act 2016* (the HS Act) commenced on 1 July 2016 providing a contemporary framework with clear roles, responsibilities and accountabilities at all levels of the WA health system, and introducing a devolved model of governance to strengthen accountability, improve transparency and support decision-making closer to service delivery and patient care.

The HS Act establishes the Director General as the System Manager, responsible for the strategic direction, oversight and management of the WA health system, through various functions such as systemwide planning and commissioning. The HS Act enables the Minister to establish Health Service Providers as separate statutory authorities, responsible and accountable for providing safe, high quality health services to the Western Australian community.

The HS Act superseded most of the out-dated *Hospital and Health Services Act 1927*; renamed the *Private Hospitals and Health Services Act 1927* it continues to provide a legislative framework for the regulation of private hospitals and psychiatric hostels in Western Australia.

Creation of Health Service Providers and Board Governance

On 1 July 2016 North Metropolitan, South Metropolitan, WA Country, Child and Adolescent, and East Metropolitan Health Services and the Quadriplegic Centre were established as board governed Health Service Providers. Board governance enables members to bring diverse expertise and experience to the strategic oversight of Health Service Provider operations, improve accountability and transparency and enables greater authority and flexibility to meet the health needs of local communities.

Health Support Services was established as a chief executive governed Health Service Provider responsible for the delivery of key support services such as technology, supply, workforce and financial services to the WA health system.

PathWest was established as a chief executive governed Health Service Provider on 15 September 2018, with responsibility for the delivery of public pathology services.

On 1 January 2019 the governance of the Quadriplegic Centre changed from board governed to chief executive governed.

In line with Recommendation 24 of the Sustainable Health Review Final Report, the governance of Health Support Services and PathWest changed from chief executive governed to board governed on 1 July 2020.

Commonwealth, Private and Community Health Services

Activity Based Funding

The principal aim of Activity Based Funding (ABF) in Western Australia is to deliver safe care of the highest quality in a timely manner, to people who need it, at an efficient price. ABF provides transparency for Government, the community and health service providers as to how public funding is used in delivering hospital services across Western Australia and monitoring of the health system performance. The CSF informs the services which are purchased by the Department of Health and the Mental Health Commission from health service providers, in conjunction with the need to align to the health system's capacity to deliver. Future purchasing priorities and contracts identified by WA Health will be linked to a hierarchy of policy and planning processes, including:

- State and Commonwealth Government policy and purchasing priorities
- resource availability
- capacity and services as specified in the CSF.

Overall ABF has established an environment for purchasing hospital services appropriately from service providers in accordance with their physical and technical capabilities. The CSF is the framework that can be applied to ensure the appropriate role delineation of services is specified to support the purchasing and commissioning of services.

As outlined in Recommendation 17 of the Sustainable Health Review, the development and implementation of a new funding and commissioning model will further enhance the linkages between the CSF and ABF to better support funding and commissioning across Western Australia.

Commonwealth agreements

WA health has collaborated and partnered with the Commonwealth Government and non government health service providers to ensure effective and efficient health care planning, funding and delivery. The National Health Reform Agreement (NHRA) reflects the partnership between the Commonwealth and the States and Territories to ensure the ongoing sustainability of public hospital funding and greater transparency for performance. The NHRA commits the Commonwealth to contribute to the cost of efficient growth in public hospital funding (capped at 6.5 per cent annual funding growth nationally), based on Activity Based Funding wherever practicable. It also provides the policy basis for the roles and functions of national health bodies, including the Independent Hospital Pricing Authority and the Administrator of the National Health Funding Pool.

On 29 May 2020, the Prime Minister announced that all jurisdictions had signed an addendum to the NHRA for the period 2020–21 to 2024–25 (2020–25 NHRA). The 2020–25 NHRA continues the key funding and governance arrangements contained in the original NHRA, while committing jurisdictions to new arrangements for novel high-cost therapies and private patients treated in public hospitals. The 2020–25 NHRA also flags long-term health reforms which strongly align to key reform directions and recommendations in the Sustainable Health Review.

Separately, in March 2020, the WA Premier signed the *COVID-19 National Partnership on COVID-19 Response* on behalf of the State. This agreement secures a 50 per cent Commonwealth contribution towards the cost of COVID-19-related public hospital services and public health activities delivered by States. The agreement will operate for the period of activation of the Australian Health Sector Emergency Response Plan for Novel Coronavirus 2019, as declared by the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee.

National Disability Insurance Scheme

The *National Disability Strategy 2010–2020* (the Strategy) sets out a ten-year national plan for improving life for Australians with disability, their families and carers. The Strategy was structured around six broad outcome areas:

1. Inclusive and accessible communities
2. Rights protection, justice and legislation
3. Economic security
4. Personal and community support
5. Learning and skills
6. Health and wellbeing.

A policy direction of personal and community support was ‘a sustainable disability support system which is person-centred and self-directed, maximising opportunities for independence and participation in the economic, social and cultural life of the community’. The Strategy, underpinned the National Disability Insurance Scheme, gives people with disabilities, their families and carers greater choice and flexibility in the purchasing of services.

WA Primary Health Alliance

WA Health through collaboration with the WA Primary Health Alliance can improve access to appropriate services and provide seamless transition of care for patients between primary health and the hospital environment.

In 2015, the Australian government established the Primary Health Network Program across the country. Locally, the Primary Health Networks (PHNs):

- engage with local communities to understand what primary health care services would make a difference, particularly for those people at risk of poor health outcomes.
- commission health services to meet the prioritised needs of people in their regions and address identified gaps in primary health care.
- support GPs and all primary health care workers to continuously improve the vital care they provide.
- help to better integrate the local health system, and in doing so improve patient care and experience. Nationally, the 31 PHNs work together to progress the seven national priorities for primary care and are a central pillar within the National Health Reform Agreement 2020–25; with PHNs identified as the GP and primary health care partners for the State-funded health and community services.

The *WA Primary Health Alliance Strategic Plan 2020–2023: Better health, together* builds upon the collaborative spirit and commits to working with communities, primary health care providers and partners across the health system in Western Australia. The plan sets out the priorities and a path towards the vision of a more connected primary health care system – a system that minimises barriers to accessing primary health care and ensures those with the greatest health needs are cared for as close to home as possible.

Strategic priorities

Sustainable Health Review

The Sustainable Health Review: Final Report to the Western Australian Government 2019 (SHR) was published in April 2019 and includes eight Enduring Strategies and 30 Recommendations that aim to drive a cultural shift, focusing on prevention and community care, supported by a modern hospital system.

The Sustainable Health Review Panel considered sustainability through the 'Quadruple Aim of Healthcare' an internationally recognised approach organised around four pillars:

1. patient experience – improving the patient journey and satisfaction
2. quality, safety and population health – working to improve the health of the population, and improving safety and quality of healthcare
3. cost and waste reduction – improving the value of what is spent on health services and reducing waste
4. staff engagement – recognising that a happier, more engaged workforce delivers higher quality care.

The Sustainable Health Review Panel noted that sustainability can only be achieved by a strong and enduring systemwide focus driven at a local level. The WA health system must utilise the provisions in its legislation to drive necessary systemwide changes. Health entities must be supported and held accountable for making necessary changes. In parallel, the Department of Health as System Manager is also accountable for leading, directing and supporting the WA health system.

WA Health Digital Strategy 2020–2030

The WA Health Digital Strategy 2020–2030 sets a vision of how digital innovation and technology will transform health services and the way they will be delivered to the people of Western Australia in the next decade. The Digital Strategy places stakeholders – consumers, carers, clinicians and the general health workforce – at the heart of how it has been designed. The Digital Strategy has a vision for a digitally enabled public health system – from health promotion, protection and disease prevention to the acute clinical environment as well as in corporate systems and processes. Initiatives, investment priorities and resources for the Digital Strategy are focused on six strategic themes:

1. Empowered consumers – Improving equity of access and empowering consumers to become true partners in their own care.
2. Informed clinicians – Ensuring clinicians are informed to make effective decisions that advance quality and safety.
3. Optimised performance – Optimising health system performance with user-centricity, modernisation, innovation and interoperability.
4. Supported workforce – Supporting workforce engagement through connectivity and communication.
5. Enhanced public health – Protect, maintain, promote and improve the health of individuals and their community through a combination of safeguards, policies and programs.

6. Embedded innovation and research – Managing the adoption of rapidly-evolving technologies and creating value for the system.

Review of Safety and Quality in the WA health system

Constantly striving to provide the safest and highest quality care to our patients and the community is the core business of the WA health system.

Steadfastly maintaining and growing this focus is even more critical in times of system change. The safety and quality of our health services and providing an environment where innovation in delivering world-class health care is promoted is fundamental to providing real value to the community and to providing a sustainable health system for future generations.

To undertake the review, Professor Hugo Mascie-Taylor, an internationally recognised expert with a distinguished background in clinical, regulatory and leadership roles was engaged by the Director General in 2017 to complete this review of safety and quality in the WA health system.

The review was not a reaction to poor quality or major adverse events; it was a proactive measure focused on the effectiveness of current systemwide arrangements, strategic priorities for safety and quality, and on areas for improvement and future development.

Western Australian Mental Health, Alcohol and Other Drug Services Plan 2015–2025

The Western Australian Mental Health, Alcohol and Other Drug Services Plan 2015–2025 (the Plan) is the Mental Health Commission’s key planning tool for the mental health, alcohol and other drug sector.

The Plan was developed through an extensive consultation process with stakeholders across the sector and outlines how the system can work to achieve an optimal level of services for both mental health and alcohol and other drug services.

The Plan provides a range of options for investment decisions and priority setting for all levels of Government and non-Government stakeholders, based on the optimal mix of mental health, alcohol and other drug services required for the population of Western Australia, and subject to regular budgetary processes.

The Plan Update 2018 is the first scheduled remodelling of the optimal level and mix of services for Western Australian mental health and alcohol and other drug (AOD) services as outlined in the Plan. While the estimated optimal mix and levels of service have been revised, the Plan remains the primary reference for mental health and AOD services development, particularly as it relates to strategic priorities. *The Plan Update 2018* provides revised modelling of service types, levels and locations required in Western Australia until the end of 2025.

Mental Health Act 2014

The mental health law in Western Australia is the *Mental Health Act 2014*. It relates to:

- when a person can be provided with mental health treatment
- the criteria for referring a person for an examination by a psychiatrist
- when a person can be made an involuntary patient on an inpatient treatment order or a community treatment order
- how inpatient treatment orders and community treatment orders operate
- the rights of persons with mental illness and their personal support persons.

Review of the Clinical Governance of Public Mental Health Services in Western Australia

The Review was established in response to recommendations made by the 2017 Review of Safety and Quality in the WA health system and 2018 Sustainable Health Review Interim Report. The Review was completed in 2019 and informed by extensive consultation across the mental health sector and sought input from clinicians, consumers, carers and family representatives.

The Review highlighted the importance of an integrated, strengthened mental health system, highlighting areas for further consultation and development in relation to mental health clinical governance and clinical leadership.

Elective services reform

In January 2016, the WA Elective Services Target (WEST) replaced the National Elective Surgery Target (NEST) following the expiry of the National Partnership Agreement on Improving Public Hospital Services in 2015. WEST aims to ensure timely access to public elective surgical services.

At the request of the COAG Health Council, the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons and the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare national definitions for elective surgery urgency categories were developed to facilitate access to elective surgery according to clinical need, maximise equity of access, minimise harm associated with delayed access and support an appropriate balance between consistency of practice and clinical decision making. The National Elective Surgery Categorisation Guideline (April 2015) simplifies the urgency category definitions as follows:

- **Category 1:** Procedures that are clinically indicated within 30 days.
- **Category 2:** Procedures that are clinically indicated within 90 days.
- **Category 3:** Procedures that are clinically indicated within 365 days.

The Elective Surgery Access and Waiting List Management Policy (MP 0050/17), aligned to the National Elective Surgery Categorisation Guideline, reflects the WA health system's strong commitment to a consistent, patient-focused approach to the efficient, timely and equitable provision of elective surgery services.

Outpatient Reform Program

The Outpatient Reform Program is a systemwide program of work established in 2018 that aims to position the WA health system to provide timely, equitable, cost-effective and clinically appropriate access to outpatient care.

The Program of work will deliver on Sustainable Health Review Recommendation 11:

Improve timely access to outpatient services through:

- a. Moving routine, non-urgent and less complex specialist outpatient services out of hospital settings in partnership with primary care
- b. Maximising digital outpatient consultations.

The vision for the Program is 'Transforming the patient journey – making it simpler to navigate; ensuring every appointment adds value; and improving access for those most in need'.

Projects and initiatives are being delivered in a phased approach across five workstreams:

1. Modernising the Central Referral Service
2. Ensuring Appropriate Pathways to Care
3. Standardised and Contemporary Waitlist Management
4. Maximising Digital Consultations for Outpatient Services
5. Enhancing Transparent Public Reporting for Outpatients.

Infrastructure

Since the release of the Clinical Services Framework 2014–2024, the WA health system has seen the construction and commissioning of several new or upgraded health facilities including:

- Fiona Stanley Hospital, final stage opened March 2015
- Busselton Health Campus, opened April 2015
- Kalgoorlie Health Campus, opened August 2015
- St John of God Midland Public Hospital, opened November 2015
- Perth Children's Hospital, opened May 2018
- Katanning Health Service, April 2018
- Karratha Health Campus, opened September 2018.

WA End-of-Life and Palliative Care Strategy 2018–2028

The WA End-of-Life and Palliative Care Strategy 2018–2028 (the Strategy) provides strategic state-wide direction and outlines the values and priorities for end-of-life and palliative care in WA over the next 10 years. The Strategy places people and their family/ carer at the centre of care and aims to provide this care within a culture of compassion and excellence. It describes how end-of-life and palliative care systems and services can work collaboratively to provide integrated high-quality care at end-of-life. The Strategy informs public, private, community and non-government health sectors of the priority areas within end-of-life and palliative care over the next 10 years. The Strategy acknowledges existing systems, services and programs

that already contribute to these priority areas. The Strategy is applicable to all services in WA that support and care for people with life-limiting illness, and their families, from paediatric services to aged care services, including:

- public, private, community, aged care services and non-government organisations, including primary healthcare teams
- administrators in public, private, community, aged care services and non-government organisations (including training, research and educational institutions)

This includes specialist and non-specialist teams providing end-of-life care and specialist palliative care teams with recognised qualifications or accredited training in palliative care. It is also relevant to people, their family/carer and the wider community.

End of Life Choices

The WA health system is committed to ensuring the highest quality end of life and palliative care for all Western Australians. With an ever-growing and ageing population, a renewed focus on these issues is vital so that people with life-limiting or terminal illness can live their lives fully and as comfortably as possible.

In 2017, a Joint Select Committee on End of Life Choices was established by the Parliament of Western Australia. The Committee undertook an Inquiry into the need for laws in Western Australia (WA) to allow citizens to make informed decisions regarding their own end-of-life choices. The Committee handed down its report *My Life, My Choice* to both Houses of Parliament on 23 August 2018 that outlined 52 findings and made 24 recommendations in relation to end-of-life choices.

Voluntary Assisted Dying Legislation

In August 2019 the Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill 2019 was introduced into the Western Australian Parliament.

On 10 December 2019 the Bill completed passage through Parliament and received Royal Assent on 19 December 2019.

Part 1 of the Act (other than divisions 2 to 4) commenced on Royal Assent and the rest of the Act will commence upon proclamation which is scheduled for mid-2021.

Public Health

Public Health Act 2016

The new *Public Health Act 2016* provides modern legislation to regulate public health in Western Australia.

The Act repealed much of the outdated *Health Act 1911*. It reforms and improves Western Australian regulation on public health. It better protects and promotes public health and will prevent illness and injury.

The *Public Health Act 2016* provides a flexible and proactive framework for the regulation of public health, with key features including:

- promoting public health and well-being in the community
- helping to prevent disease, injury, disability and premature death
- informing individuals and communities about public health risks
- encouraging individuals and their communities to plan for, create and maintain a healthy environment
- supporting programs and campaigns intended to improve public health
- collecting information about the incidence and prevalence of diseases and other public health risks for research purposes
- reducing the health inequalities in public health of disadvantaged communities.

The *Public Health Act 2016* provides a modern, flexible and proactive risk-based framework for the regulation of public health.

Public health strategic plans and frameworks

The Sustainable Health Review Final Report is the blueprint for the transformation of the WA health system over the next ten years and the first of its *Enduring Strategies is to 'commit and collaborate to address major public health issues'*.

The increased focus and investment in prevention for which Recommendation 1 calls can only occur with an engaged and coordinated approach across the whole system. Improving the health and wellbeing of the population reduces demand on the rest of the health system, particularly by the reduction in demand for clinical services due to preventable chronic disease and injury caused by common risk factors (smoking, obesity and harmful alcohol use).

There are several important public health strategic plans and frameworks that support an integrated approach to public health for the State.

Aboriginal Health

- The [WA Aboriginal Health and Wellbeing Framework 2015–2030](#) identifies key guiding principles, strategic direction and priority areas for the next 15 years, to improve the health and wellbeing of Aboriginal people in Western Australia. It was developed to ensure that Aboriginal people in WA have access to high quality health care and services, while assisting communities to make good health a priority through a focus on prevention and early intervention.
- The [Outcomes Framework for Aboriginal Health 2020–2030](#) supports the WA Aboriginal

Health and Wellbeing Framework 2015–2030, and is designed to guide areas within WA Health that fund Aboriginal community-based health services, and the associated service providers, to better design, deliver and evaluate programs and services through an outcomes based model. The Outcomes Framework seeks to build the overall capacity and responsiveness of the WA health system, so that over time, it can better meet both the clinical and cultural needs of Aboriginal people, families and communities.

- The [WA Health Aboriginal Workforce Strategy 2014–2024](#) guides health services in the development of Aboriginal recruitment, training and retention strategies in recognition that Aboriginal people bring a diverse range of skills to the health sector, including the ability to break down barriers to access, and cultural perspectives which help meet the needs of Aboriginal people.

Environmental Health

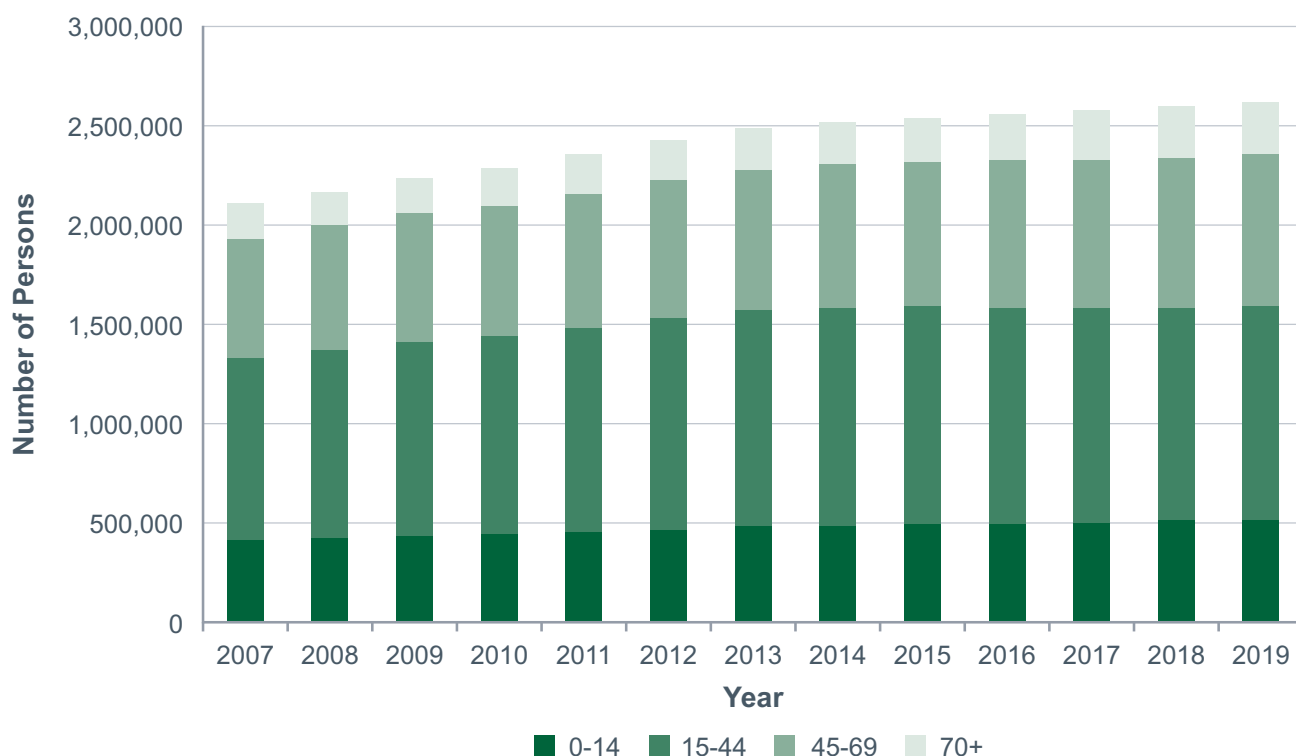
The [Environmental Health Directorate Strategic Plan 2020–2023](#) outlines the strategic outcomes and priorities of the Environmental Health Directorate for three years, with the aim of preventing disease, illness, injury, disability and premature death arising from environmental exposures and other environmental health impacts.

WA population and demand

Population

The WA estimated resident population as at 30 June 2019 was 2,621,680 people an increase of 104,072 people since 30 June 2014 (4%). This is a marked decrease in growth from the previous five years (2009 to 2014) when the population increased by 300,422 people (13%). In 2009 the proportion of people aged 65 and over was 12%, increasing to 15% in 2019.

WA estimated resident population, 2007–2019

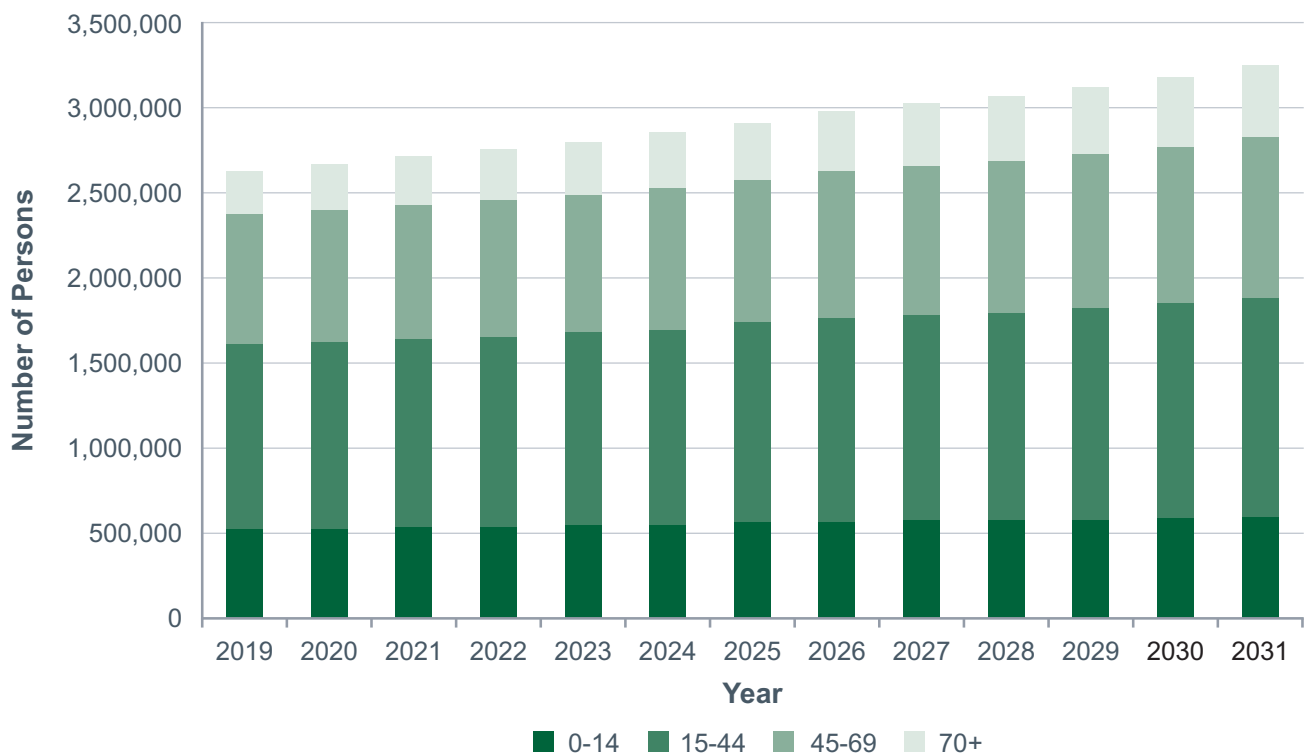

Over the next five years, to 30 June 2024, the population is projected to increase by 210,133 (8%) with the proportion of those aged 65 and over increasing to 16%. Population projections are obtained from WA Tomorrow, 2018 developed by the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage and have not taken into account changes due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The COVID-19 pandemic is expected to reduce both interstate and overseas migration to WA, in addition, the fertility rate is expected to decrease. Initial estimates for WA have been produced by Treasury, these indicate that the population will increase by about 135,000 (5%) by 30 June 2024. The reduction in growth is mainly for people aged less than 50.

Demand

Inpatient, emergency department and outpatient activity demand projections are undertaken to determine the output of the WA Health system. These projections are refined through clinical consultation, consideration of policy directions and input from clinical service planners. It should be noted that no matter how carefully these projections are developed they become less exact the further they reach into the future.

Increases in demand for hospital services are driven by:

- Population growth and ageing
- Technology development
- Diagnostic and pharmaceutical changes
- Patient expectation.

Over the next five years there is an expectation that there will be continued growth in demand for services with an 11% increase in inpatient separations, a 9% increase in emergency department presentations and 22% growth in outpatient occasions of service.

To look at a hospital, scan horizontally along the row for the nominated facility, then scan down to view the service provided for the specialty of interest.

To look at a specialty scan down the rows to view the specialty and across the row to the hospital of interest.

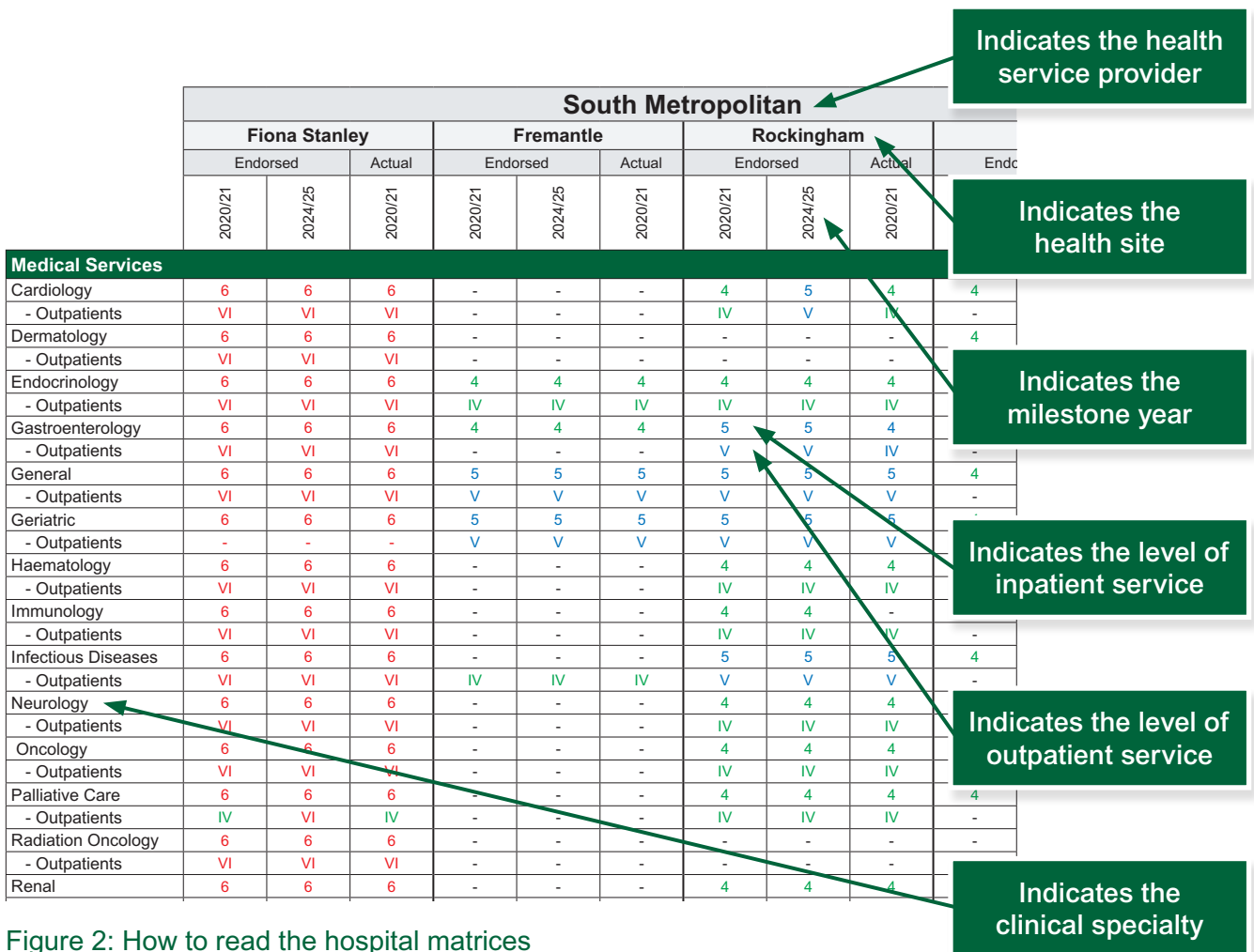


Figure 2: How to read the hospital matrices

Planning Intervals

It is important to note that the CSF 2020 Addendum has been published as an interim planning document.

Updates reflected in the CSF 2020 Addendum are focused on ensuring the key components of the CSF are current and robust enough to guide the system over the next two years while a fully revised clinical planning document is developed.

It should be noted that as part of the process to develop a fully revised clinical planning document in Phase 2, specific reviews related to a specialty and or location will be completed. These processes may identify a site as offering a different level of service from 2024/25 and beyond.

In this update, the Hospital Matrices reflect the levels of service across two time intervals, current (2020/21) and 2024/25.

In terms of the 2020/21 interval, two positions have been reflected – the endorsed level and the actual level of service as follows:

Endorsed 2020/21	2018/19 levels of service previously endorsed in the CSF 2014–24 (2017 update) or through an assessment in this update.
Endorsed 2024/25	2024/25 planned levels of service previously endorsed in the CSF 2014–24 (2017 update) or through an assessment in this update.
Actual 2020/21	Current levels of service, self-assessed and reported by HSPs. These indicate the levels of service it is currently operating at in 2020/21, in comparison to its endorsed 2020/21 levels. Services which are currently operating above the endorsed 2020/21 or 2024/25 levels are highlighted for review in Phase 2.

The role delineations assigned across this time interval, reflect the current level of service and the planned development of hospital-based services over the period as described by the hospital service definitions.

Consistent with previous iterations of the CSF, it should be noted that the role delineation level shown at 2024/24 is not necessarily the point in time when a service transitions from one level to a different level. Instead this provides planning milestones for what role delineation level of service is currently or anticipated to be in place by that time.

For example, if a hospital is delineated as offering a Level 3 capability for a service in 2020/21 and a Level 4 in 2024/25 the move to the new level of service could occur at any point in the period between 2020/21 and 2024/25.

Please also note that as part of Phase 2 of the Clinical Services Framework Refresh specific reviews related to a specialty and/or location may identify a site as offering a different level of service from 2024/25 and beyond.
