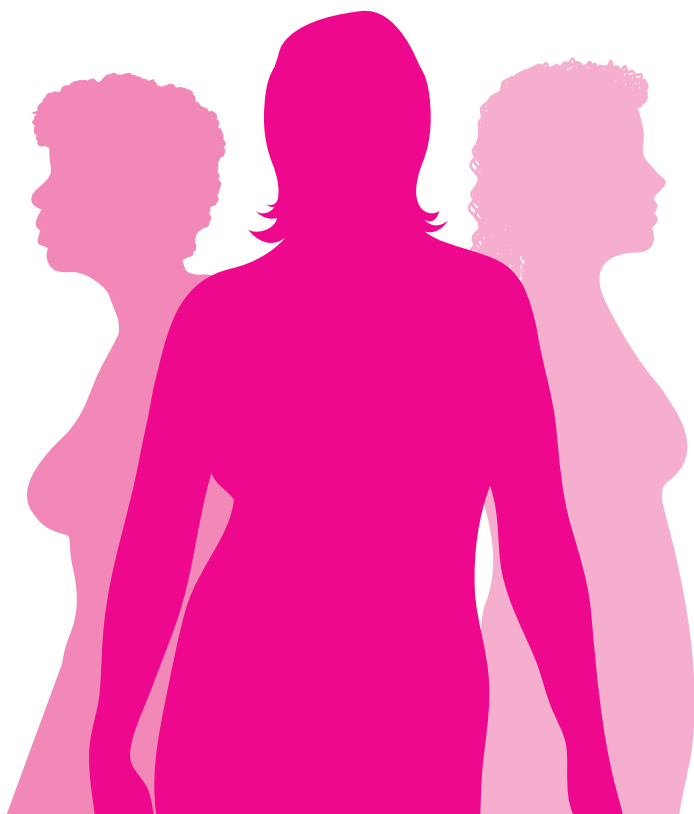


# BreastScreen WA After 75... should I have screening mammograms?

## Here is some information to help you decide.

- BreastScreen WA is a service targeted to women aged 50–74 years. Women aged over 40 may also attend.
- We also re-invite already enrolled women aged 40–74 years.
- Once you turn 75 you will no longer be sent a letter reminding you to attend for your two-yearly mammogram. However you are encouraged to ring BreastScreen WA for an appointment prior to the due date.
- Some women in your age group may decide not to have screening mammograms as other medical conditions or lifestyle issues may take higher priority.
- The decision is yours, but remember the risk of breast cancer does increase with age and you are welcome to attend BreastScreen WA for a free screening mammogram every two years.
