## Organisational Structure

WA Health consists of the eight separate health organisations, including the Department of Health and Health Service Providers (HSPs). WA Health is also referred to as the WA health system. Each HSP is responsible and accountable for the delivery of safe, high quality, efficient and economical health services to their local areas and communities.
