Food Act 2008 Section 22 (compliance with Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code)	Non-compliance with Standard 3.2.2 - Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 19(1) of the Food Standards Code in that the food premises were not maintained to a standard of cleanliness where there was no accumulation of food waste, dirt and grease, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008. - Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 19(2) of the Food Standards Code in that the food business failed to maintain all equipment to a standard of cleanliness where there was no accumulation of food waste, dirt and grease, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008. - Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 21(1) of the Food Standards Code in that the food business failed to maintain the food premises in a good state of repair, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.	Global fine \$15,000.00 plus costs of \$1,646.00.

	Failed to comply with a requirement of Standard 3.2.2 Clause 6(1)(a) of the Food Standards Code in that when storing food the food business failed to store the food in such a way that it was protected from the likelihood of contamination, contrary to Section 22(1) of the Food Act 2008.	
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
