# Vaccine Update #470 – Shelflife Extension –ABRYSVO

### Shelf-life Extension – ABRYSVO (RSV vaccine)

Pfizer Australia Pty Ltd advises that, following the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) approval, the shelf life of the below listed batches of ABRYSVO is extended an additional 48 months. The requirement to store ABRYSVO in a refrigerator (2°C - 8°C) prior to reconstitution remains unchanged. For full storage requirements before and after reconstitution, please refer to the ABRYSVO® Product Information available on the TGA website. Please refer to the table below for the updated expiry dates.

If you are currently in possession of ABRYSVO® stock with batch numbers different to those listed above, the expiry date remains unchanged. Please continue to use the printed expiry date on the packaging.

If you have stock with the affected batches, you will be mailed stickers with your vaccine delivery starting in two weeks. In the meantime, please use the information above, and mark your vaccines accordingly. Please follow the below instructions to add the expiry date extension sticker to your ABRYSVO® pack.

### Adverse event and cold chain breach reporting

Reporting of adverse events following immunisation (AEFI) to the Western Australian Vaccine Safety Surveillance (WAVSS) system is a condition of Structured Administrations and Supply Arrangements (SASAs) that provide the authority for immunisation providers to safely administer vaccinations in WA.

ABRYSVO is subject to additional monitoring in Australia. This will allow quick identification of new safety information. Please report any suspected adverse events to WAVSS at https://www.safevac.org.au/

To receive government-funded vaccines and immunisations, providers must follow the WA <u>cold chain protocol</u>. Providers must advise their <u>WA Health Public Health Unit</u> when a cold chain breach occurs or to seek thermal stability advice for other incidents where government-funded vaccines and immunisations are involved.
