

Congenital syphilis

If you have syphilis, it is important you take the antibiotics prescribed.

Without treatment, syphilis can pass onto your baby. This is called congenital syphilis and may cause:

- Miscarriage
- Premature birth
- · Stillbirth and neonatal death
- · Enlarged liver and spleen
- · Deformities of the teeth and bones
- · Blisters and skin rashes
- Developmental delay

Antibiotic treatment can prevent this.
