




The WA TB Control Program (WATBCP) located at the Anita Clayton Centre offers a specialised public health service that provides a state-wide outpatient service for the treatment, surveillance and prevention of tuberculosis. The WATBCP provides Specialist Medical advice to all cases of Active TB and Latent TB infection. There is a dedicated paediatric clinic to ensure the needs of children and their families are met. Individual case management for all clients is a nurse led approach that is an integral part of the success of the WATBCP.


Tuberculosis cases WA, 2020


People treated for latent TB 91 % completed treatment






Incidence of TB in WA is stable; but the decline towards elimination is yet to be achieved (The Australian National TB Strategic Plan).

Young adults represent the biggest proportion, 68% of TB cases in the 15-44 age group. Children less than 15 years of age, 4% of TB cases (1 per 100,000 population).

Treatment outcome TB cases notified in 2019




