

MEASURING OUTCOMES AND COSTS

Health care is realised over time

- The assessment of health outcomes should incorporate both near term and relevant longer term aspects of care:
 - A move away from episodic assessment to a longitudinal view of healthcare
 - Implications for patient data capture and associated system infrastructure
- Costs over the full cycle of care direct and indirect

WHO DEFINES OUTCOMES?

- Clinical outcomes are the focus of practitioners and important for patients' welfare
- Outcomes that matter to individual patients
- Population health outcomes (outcomes that society is willing to pay for?)
- Clinical quality registries: focus on safety and quality




