## 1. Purpose

The purpose of the Non-Admitted Data Collection Data Dictionary is to detail the data elements captured in the Non-Admitted Data Collection (NADC).

The *Non-Admitted Data Collection Data Dictionary* is a related document under [MP 0164/21 Patient Activity Data Policy](#).

This data dictionary is to be read in conjunction with this policy and other related documents and supporting information as follows:

This Data Dictionary is to also be read in conjunction with [MP 0191/25 Outpatient Services Policy](#).

## 2. Background

The use of non-admitted patient data by the WA health system is dependent on high quality data that are valid, accurate and consistent.

For the purposes of this document, the terms “patient”, “client” and “person” are used interchangeably. Within many non-admitted settings the term “client” is being increasingly adopted to reflect that some services are not focused solely on treating health conditions but aim to empower individuals through collaboration. However, it is acknowledged that the term “patient” is generally the preferred term in a hospital setting.

## 3. Recording of data

Data that are submitted to the NADC must be recorded in accordance with the Data Definitions ([Section 4](#)).

Please note there are multiple source (feeder) systems that submit non-admitted patient activity data to the Non-Admitted Data Collection. The permitted values identified in this document consider all relevant feeder systems; inclusion of a value in the permitted values list does not imply it is permitted or available in all source systems.

## 4. Data definitions

The following section provides specific information about data elements captured in the NADC, including definitions, permitted values, guide for use, whether or not an element is mandatory, and operational examples.

All information relating to data elements in this data dictionary is specific to the NADC and caution should be taken if these data elements are compared with those of other data collections.

Where relevant, related national definitions have been referenced. The Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW) is acknowledged for services provided in relation to the Metadata Online Registry (METeOR), Australia’s repository for national metadata standards for the health, community services, early childhood, homelessness, and housing assistance sectors, which is owned by the AIHW.

Note the requirement status for each data element. Data elements can be either Mandatory, Conditional or Optional. An explanation is provided below.

**Mandatory**

These data elements must be included in the data record that is submitted to the NADC.

**Conditional**

These data elements are only mandatory if certain criteria are met.

**Optional**

These data elements are available for submission to the NADC, but are not mandatory.

## Appointment - Account Number

<b>Definition:</b>	A unique identifier for an appointment assigned by the source information system.
<b>Requirement status:</b>	Mandatory
<b>Field name:</b>	APPOINTMENT_ACCOUNT_NUMBER
<b>Data type:</b>	String
<b>Format:</b>	X(50)

### Guide for use

The Appointment Account Number must be a unique number for each episode of service.

Appointment Account Numbers may not be unique across different feeder systems. Care should therefore be taken when using the data element.

This Appointment Account Number is permanent for the record and is not re-used irrespective of the appointment status, outcome or attendance.

When an appointment is made, it must be linked to a registered referral.

The Appointment Account Number enables the patient-level non-admitted activity to be matched to associated data in the Department of Health WA costing system.

## Appointment - Arrival Time

<b>Definition:</b>	The time the patient arrived for the appointment.
<b>Requirement status:</b>	Conditional
<b>Field name:</b>	APPOINTMENT_CLIENT_ARRIVAL_TIME
<b>Data type:</b>	Datetime
<b>Format:</b>	HH:MM:SS

### Guide for use

**Condition:** If the patient arrived for their appointment and the source system collects this data element then this must be provided, otherwise it will be blank.

## Appointment - Attendance

<b>Definition:</b>	The nature of the patient's attendance at the appointment.
<b>Requirement status:</b>	Conditional
<b>Source data element(s):</b>	See guide for use (webPAS)

<b>Format:</b>	X(50)

## Derivation Logic

For webPAS data, This data element is derived using the following sequential logic.

### **Appointment Attendance = 'DNA' (Did not attend)**

**Include** records where:

- [Appointment Processing Status] is 'Rescheduled'
- AND [Appointment Outcome] is not 'PLN' (Patient left not seen)

### **Appointment Attendance = 'DNW' (Did not wait)**

**Include** unassigned records where:

- [Appointment Processing Status] is 'Rescheduled'
- AND [Appointment Outcome] is 'PLN' (Patient left not seen)

**Appointment Attendance = 'MCC' (Multidisciplinary case conference)**

**Include** unassigned records where:

- [Appointment Delivery Mode] is 'MCC' (Multidisciplinary case conference)

**Appointment Attendance = 'NCE' (Non-client event)**

**Include** unassigned records where:

- AND [Appointment Type] is 'NCE' (Non-client event)

**Appointment Attendance = 'DNW' (Did not wait)**

**Include** unassigned records where:

- [Appointment Outcome] is 'PLN' (Patient left not seen)

**Appointment Attendance = 'ATT' (Attended)**

**Include** unassigned records where:

- [Appointment Processing Status] is 'Attended'

**Appointment Attendance = 'DNA' (Did not attend)**

**Include** unassigned records where:

- [Appointment Processing Status] is 'Did Not Attend'

**Include** unassigned records where:

- [Appointment Non-Attendance Reason] is not NULL
- AND [Appointment Non-Attendance Reason] is not blank

**Appointment Attendance = 'UNK' (Unknown)**

**Include** unassigned records where:

- [Appointment Outcome] is 'UNK' (Unknown)

**Appointment Attendance = 'NSP' (Not specified)**

**Include** all remaining unassigned records.

**Guide for Use**

**Condition:** This data element is Mandatory if the source system is not webPAS.

<b>Definition:</b>	The date on which the scheduled appointment was cancelled.

**Condition:** This data element is mandatory if a scheduled appointment is cancelled otherwise it will be blank.

<b>Definition:</b>	The healthcare interaction category of the patient at the time of the appointment.
<b>Requirement status:</b>	Mandatory
<b>Source data element(s):</b>	Patient Type (webPAS)

<b>Data type:</b>	String

## Guide for use

This data element is used to determine the healthcare interaction category of a non-admitted patient service event when the Appointment Client Type is coded as 'OP' (Outpatient).

Records that do not have an Appointment Client Type of 'OP' (Outpatient) are excluded when counting attended appointments or non-admitted patient service events.

If the client is admitted as a privately-funded patient at a private hospital at the time of receiving a publicly-funded outpatient clinic service, they can be assigned an Appointment Client Type of 'OP' (Outpatient) for that appointment.

However, non-admitted events are still deemed valid service events for the purposes of national reporting when the care type of an admitted patient is not in scope for reporting to the Hospital Morbidity Data Collection (such as residential aged care and flexible care).

If the client is in active emergency attendance at the time of receiving a publicly-funded outpatient clinic service, they must be assigned an Appointment Client Type of 'ED' (Emergency Department) for that appointment.

## Appointment - Contracting Establishment

<b>Definition:</b>	The contracting entity if the appointment was carried out under a contract for services.
<b>Requirement status:</b>	Conditional
<b>Field name:</b>	APPT_CONTRACTING_ESTAB_NUMBER
<b>Data type:</b>	Number
<b>Format:</b>	N[NNN]
<b>Description field name:</b>	APPT_CONTRACTING_ESTAB_NAME
<b>Description data type:</b>	String
<b>Description format:</b>	X(100)

### Permitted Values

Refer to the Department of Health's Establishment List.

### Guide for use

If the appointment was carried out by the healthcare provider as part of a contract for services, reporting this data element is mandatory.

The "contracting entity" is the establishment which owns the contract and is responsible for payment to the healthcare provider for providing the service.

Establishment numbers are assigned by the Department of Health and a list of valid establishments is provided in the [WA Health Establishment List](#).

### Examples

## Appointment - Date

<b>Definition:</b>	The date on which the appointment is scheduled.
<b>Requirement status:</b>	Mandatory
<b>Field name:</b>	APPOINTMENT_DATE
<b>Data type:</b>	Date
<b>Format:</b>	YYYY-MM-DD

### Guide for use

For safety, when a non-admitted patient commenced an appointment before midnight and the patient is still in the hospital after midnight, this is recorded as two appointments. The date on which the service commenced must be recorded for the first appointment and the date after midnight for the second appointment.

The Appointment type for the appointment after midnight must be recorded as a Chart only or Non-client event to ensure that it is excluded from reports of non-admitted activity.

<b>Definition:</b>	Up to 4 diagnoses or procedure codes describing care related to the patient's appointment.
<b>Requirement status:</b>	Optional
<b>Field name:</b>	APPOINTMENT_DIAGNOSIS_CODE_N
<b>Data type:</b>	String
<b>Format:</b>	X(100)

### Permitted Values

Permitted values are determined by the classification used. Please refer to the Appointment Diagnosis Type data item for a list of classifications.

### Guide for use

There are currently 4 appointment diagnosis code N fields. (N) represents a numeric range from 1 to 4 (e.g. appt\_diagnosis\_code\_1, appt\_diagnosis\_code\_2).

## Appointment - Diagnosis Type

<b>Definition:</b>	Coding standard used to describe up to 4 conditions or procedures that relates to the appointment care (Appointment – Diagnosis Code).
<b>Requirement status:</b>	Optional

There are three components to the Commonwealth definition of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander:

- descent
- self-identification
- community acceptance.

In practice, it is not feasible to collect information on community acceptance in general purpose data collections. Therefore, standard questions on Aboriginal status relate to descent and self identification only.

Within Western Australia, the term Aboriginal is used in preference to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, in recognition that Aboriginal peoples are the original inhabitants of Western Australia. No disrespect is intended to our Torres Strait Islander colleagues and community.

When the exact date of birth is unknown, please estimate the person's age and record the date of birth as appropriate. Collected or estimated age would be in years for adults, and to the nearest three months (or less) for children aged less than two years.

There must be no spaces between the alpha and numeric values. The alpha characters in the first position refer to the Australian States' initials. Therefore, the only valid characters in the first position of this field are N, Q, S, T, V and W. Veterans' from the ACT and the Northern Territory have the initials N and S respectively.

Patients who choose to give up their entitlement for treatment under the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986 (Cth)* must have their card colour and DVA File Number recorded, regardless of the type of Funding Source indicated.

To minimise discrepancies in the recording and reporting of name information, establishments should ask the person for their "First Given Name" and 'Family name'. These may be different from the name that the person may prefer the establishment to use.

### Examples

Scenario	Reportable value
A patient arrives at the Albany Hospital Outpatient Clinic and his name is John Smith.	SMITH
A patient is identified by a first given name of Anastasia and has no Surname.	ANASTASIA

Babies of multiple births should be reported in the sequence of their birth (i.e. Baby One of Jane, Baby Two of Jane, etc).

If the First Given Name of a person over 28 days old is unknown, 'Unknown' is valid.

Alias names should be recorded in the Alias field in the hospital's Central Patient Index (CPI) or Patient Master Index (PMI). The use of brackets ( ) for alias names is not accepted.

## Guide for use

The collection of Gender is mandatory to support national reporting.

Gender includes the following concepts:

- Gender identity is about who a person feels themselves to be.
- Gender expression is the way a person expresses their gender. A person's gender expression may vary depending on the context, for instance, expressing different genders at work and at home.
- Gender experience describes a person's alignment with the sex recorded for them at birth i.e. a cis experience or a trans experience.

Gender is often used interchangeably with sex, however they are distinct concepts and it is important to differentiate between them.

When comparing the concepts of sex and gender:

- Sex is understood in relation to sex characteristics.
- Gender is about social and cultural differences in identity, expression and experience.

While they are related concepts, caution should be exercised when comparing counts for

gender with those for sex.

## Examples

Scenario	Reportable value

- The term 'Sex' is a biological concept that describes, in part, a person's physical features, including genitalia, other sexual reproductive anatomy, chromosomes, hormones, and secondary physical features emerging from puberty.
- The term 'Gender' is a social concept that describes the way in which a person identifies and the way they are recognised within a community. A person's gender identity may not always be exclusively male or female and may not always correspond with their sex assigned at birth.

While sex and gender are related concepts, caution should be exercised when comparing counts for sex with those for gender.

Sex recorded at birth is important clinical information and must be collected for all patients. To ensure accuracy and consistency of data collection, gender diverse patients must still report their sex recorded at birth and their current gender in the gender field..

The use of code X 'Another term' replaces 'Other' and 'Intersex or indeterminate' in previous versions of this code list. This option recognises that there are a range of different terms used.
